Professor John Thwaites AM Chair

This is the first year since the McKinnon Institute was established that there has been a federal election, and the first time that we have conducted a new members program.

I had the opportunity to attend some of the new member sessions at the federal parliament and was impressed by the quality and diversity of this cohort of new parliamentarians. I am sure they will make a big impact on Australian politics in the coming years.

Our sessions for new members were devised with the assistance of the major parties and the crossbench. This highlights that the McKinnon Institute relies for its success on being non-partisan and having the trust and respect of all groups in the parliament. We also significantly rely on the support and assistance we get from the Presiding Officers and the Clerks of the Parliament.

I personally found the session led by Paul Ritchie and James Button on preparing for the first speech fascinating. It took me back to my first speech as a Victorian parliamentarian, and I can see that first speeches are a good deal more sophisticated and inspiring than they used to be. We built on that session by producing a video on the first speech for new members of the Victorian Parliament.

Another highlight for me was the opportunity for the Advanced Political Leadership course to be conducted face-to-face whereas last year, because of Covid-19 protocols, we were largely online. The strong message from the participants was that face-to-face is preferred. The group built a strong level of trust and esprit de corps, which deepened the impact of the course.

This has been a year of significant growth for the McKinnon Institute. A total of 73 MPs took part in our courses taking our total number of alumni to 157. In addition we ran very successful events featuring former UK Prime Ministers Rt Hon David Cameron and Rt Hon Theresa May as part of our mission to promote discussion and debate about building better political leadership.

The McKinnon Institute is still relatively new but we are building a reputation for quality programs and bi-partisanship that sets us in good stead to support Members of Parliament and improve the quality of political leadership in Australia.

2022 was a year of consolidation and expansion.

We expanded our delivery to MPs from South Australia, Tasmania and the ACT. We now have more than 150 alumni, from every Australian parliament, who have participated in at least one of our three programs.

It was a pleasure to deliver our flagship program, Advanced Political Leadership (APL), for the second time but without the impact of lockdowns and border closures. We again had more applications than available places and were supported by our independent selection panel, comprised of the Hon Jenny Macklin, the Hon Colin Barnett, and Dr Martin Parkinson AC. APL is designed and led by Professor Rod Glover and Professor Anne Tiernan, along with a range of distinguished guest presenters who are experts in their fields.

With increasing numbers of APL alumni being appointed to the ministry, we have provided direct support to a number of new ministers. We also launched our alumni offering. This included an event in Melbourne with former British PM, the Rt Hon Theresa May MP, and another event with her successor, the Rt Hon David Cameron, in Sydney.

We delivered Political Leadership for 2022, as the fourth iteration of the Political Leadership program. We again expanded this online program to new jurisdictions, adding MPs from the federal, Tasmanian and South Australian parliaments.

This year we began providing training for new MPs, when we partnered with the federal parliament following the 2022 election.

We welcomed the McKinnon Institute's inaugural ambassadors: former Queensland minister, Ian Walker; former Speaker of the federal parliament, the Hon Tony Smith; and former federal cabinet minister, the Hon Kate Ellis. Our ambassadors support us in engaging with MPs and are also very welcome contributors to our programs.

During 2022, the McKinnon Institute welcomed new staff in programs, engagement and communications. I'm grateful to each and every member of the team for their creativity, hard work and commitment, as well as the board of the McKinnon Institute, and Monash University.

It is very satisfying to see MPs from throughout Australia embrace the opportunity offered by the McKinnon Institute to learn and grow, and to create an organisation that is a non-partisan and not-for-profit resource for improving our representation and governance. It is a challenge and a pleasure to lead it.

### The numbers

#### **MKI Alumni**

Prior to the Victorian state election in November, 18% of current MPs across Australia's nine parliaments had participated in an MKI program. Across the nine parliaments, the political affiliation of the participants was comparable to the party composition of the parliaments. At the end of 2022, 157 current and former MPs had participated in MKI programs, with an even split of male and female MPs.

### **Advanced Political Leadership 2022**

There have now been 35 APL participants in 2 years, or around one-fifth of MKI participants.

The 18 APL 2022 participants, selected by the independent panel following an application process, were a mix of parties, genders and jurisdictions.




### Political Leadership 2022

In 2022, a total of 20 state and federal MPs from around Australia registered for the online Political Leadership program. This brings the total participation to 96 MPs across 3 years, or around three in five of MKI participants.

# Programs



#### Professor Rod Glover Academic Director

In 2022, the McKinnon Institute continued to grow its activity, running three programs:

- The second iteration of Advanced Political Leadership (July December).
- The fourth iteration of Political Leadership (October – December)
- Inaugural New Member Training for the Federal Parliament

These programs sought to engage and challenge participants, to develop in our political leaders a combination of practical skills, learning mindsets, and an ethic of service and stewardship. Our approach draws together insights from practice, research and education, and benefits from the strong engagement of Monash and wider academic expertise.



Advanced Political Leadership (APL) is Australia's first advanced leadership course for high-potential members of parliament who are assessed as having the potential to become ministers. APL is a cohort-based program, with 2022 participants selected by an independent panel comprising Dr Martin Parkinson AM, Hon Jenny Macklin and Hon Colin Barnett.





APL enables participants to reflect on their purpose, responsibilities and personal leadership challenges, the strategic policy challenges facing governments and the role of ministers in Australia's democratic system. An advanced program, it provides political leaders with access to the latest national and global thinking on contextual forces and issues bearing on policy and political leadership.

APL 2022 involved a five-day residential intensive in the Hunter Valley, supported by six half-day workshops (two face-to-face, four online). Our McKinnon Scholars engaged with around 35 presenters on a range of topics. These sessions explored the relationship between ministers and the public sector; maintaining integrity; empathy and active listening; policy tools and techniques; the prioritisation of time and resources; and Australia's strategic landscape.



Our McKinnon Scholars carved out space in their busy schedules and embraced the opportunity to step back and reflect in a non-adversarial context. I would like to acknowledge their commitment. They engaged constructively with peers from other parties and governments, and these efforts made the cohort and the program work.

34 McKinnon Scholars have now graduated from APL, of whom ten have become ministers or assistant ministers. It is truly inspiring to see the commitment to service we observe in them through APL being carried into their ministerial contributions.

# Programs

**Political Leadership 2022** was our fourth iteration of this program. The 2022 program benefited from a growing diversity of geographic and party participation. PL supports early-career and mid-career politicians to represent their communities well, grow their networks and embrace the stewardship roles they play in our democracy. PL 2022 involved six 90-minute workshops, focused on leading through uncertainty, having policy influence, and maintaining personal and staff wellbeing.





In 2022, the McKinnon Institute partnered with the Australian Parliament to provide *New Member Training*. We delivered four workshops to new MPs: setting up an electorate office, delivering your first speech, ethics and integrity, and Australia's democratic institutions. Late in 2022, we also partnered with the Victorian Parliament to develop a digital resource, Your First Speech, to help new parliamentarians plan and prepare for their first speeches.







I would like to acknowledge the invaluable contributions of my APL Program Co-Director Professor Anne Tiernan, our Senior Programs Manager Dr Rebecca Tooher and my patient and adaptable Executive Assistant Naomi Ockerse.

We look forward to continuing to grow our core academic team and faculty in 2023. In late 2022, I was delighted to welcome Professor Anne Tiernan to the McKinnon Institute as Head of Research and Professor of Political Leadership. In early 2023, we will also establish an Academic Advisory Panel to engage key faculty partners in our planning and review efforts.



# The McKinnon Faculty

In 2022, the McKinnon Institute continued to grow the quality and diversity of its faculty. This included former political leaders, senior public servants and political advisers, and leading academics and experts on topics ranging from leadership and economics, to geopolitics and complexity, to social psychology and communications.
